Dalilah's ability to vocalize this new vocabulary word empowered her to express her wants, and to sing along to *The Wheels on the Bus*. For her mom, Maria, it marked one of the most joyful moments of the past two years.

Dalilah is one of the millions of toddlers whose early social and physical development has been impacted by the pandemic. But her first two years also included eight surgeries, hundreds of hours of therapy and even a COVID-19 diagnosis.

A rare genetic condition affects Dalilah's mobility, facial features, hearing, vision, feeding and speech. She immediately qualified for the state's Early Intervention services and her family was connected to an Easterseals physical therapist. When the need for occupational, speech and nutrition therapies was identified, her parents put their trust in a full team from Easterseals DuPage & Fox Valley. A combination of tele-therapy and inperson services helped her make critical gains at a critical time.

Dalilah is a sweet, active and inquisitive two-year-old who loves to listen to music and dance. Extra effort goes into every daily task, but so does her resilient spirit. Through it all, she's learned to sit, crawl, clap and stand UP. "As advocates, we are constantly voicing what we think is right for her, but it's important to understand what she wants. She's an individual and we want to know what she has to say."
